Encourage that the process be started prior to January 1, 2006, since there are no extensions granted for this.</p> <p>#4. Jeff Rubin, Chief, Disaster Medical Services Division, extends his thank you to Robert Lashier and the committee for participation.</p> <p>#5. AED rural access grant- \$200,000 for 35 agencies.</p> <p>#6. <i>Lisa Shoenthall</i> has replaced <i>Laura Venegas</i> to manage the HRSA-BT grant.</p> <p>#7. American Heart Association has accepted the video for child care/first aid training for inhaled medications into their new curriculum. Video is available at the DHS website and can be downloaded.</p> <p>#8. EMT-P Licensure. Bill introduced that allows for fines for certain infractions. Task force reassembled to develop regulatory language for fine structure. Not yet out for public comment. Includes charging for investigations. Money collected from fines will go to the general fund.</p> <p>#9. National Registry will go to computer adapted testing for EMT-I and EMT-P by 2007. Issues are being addressed from various states that are currently “trialing” the test process.</p> <p>#10. EMT-II task Force met in 2003 with the intent of incorporating the EMT-II regulations into the EMT-I regulations. This action was challenged stating that there was no authority established that would allow this.</p>
